BROWNSBURG, IN (May 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2010) – For the fourth year, a Miniature Fine Art Exhibit will bring noted national and internationally acclaimed artists to Artistic Designs Gallery of Brownsburg, 152 East Northfield Drive.
